Other Information

A minimum of 30 hours must be earned at the University of Missouri-Kansas City, regardless of the number and level of hours earned at another institution. Undergraduate degree-seeking students are required to earn credit in at least 36 hours of coursework numbered 300 and above at UMKC. In the case of transfer credit, the coursework must be numbered as junior-senior level work by the transferring institution. Community-college transfer coursework cannot count towards the 36-hour requirement.

Program Description

The BM in Piano Performance degree program offers pedagogy, literature, collaborative piano, and chamber music experiences to students. Performance opportunities are available in venues both on and off campus, and include solo recitals, chamber music and collaborative recitals, studio classes, and master classes.

Admission Requirements

- Complete the [UMKC application](#) for admission.
- Complete the [Conservatory Supplemental Application](#) for admission.
- Qualify for the first semester freshman level of lessons on the applied instrument for 4 credits at the audition for admission.
- Show demonstrable knowledge of all major and minor scales and tonic arpeggios, parallel motion, and four octaves in moderately rapid tempo.
- Students should be able to perform Bach Two- and Three-Part Interventions; compositions corresponding in difficulty to Beethoven Sonata, Opus 14, No. 1; Mozart Fantasia in D Minor; Chopin Nocturne, Opus 44, No. 1; Schubert Impromptu, Opus 90, No. 4; and Debussy Arabesques.
