Other Information

A minimum of 30 hours must be earned at the University of Missouri-Kansas City, regardless of the number and level of hours earned at another institution. Undergraduate degree-seeking students are required to earn credit in at least 36 hours of coursework numbered 300 and above at UMKC. In the case of transfer credit, the coursework must be numbered as junior-senior level work by the transferring institution. Community-college transfer coursework cannot count towards the 36-hour requirement.

The BM in Instrumental Studies Performance degree gives students the foundation for a career in professional performance or for graduate study in performance. Foundational course work includes core music courses such as history and theory, as well as the practical courses of lessons, chamber music, ensembles, and recitals

- Qualify for the first semester freshman level of lessons on the applied instrument for 4 credits at the audition for admission.
- Show demonstrable knowledge of all major and minor scales and arpeggios in one or two octaves, etudes and solos from standard literature of the instrument.
- Membership in high-school orchestra or band is desirable.
