**What's a Mega-Major?** Offered through UMKC's University College (UCollege) Mega-Majors are a starting point for students who have yet to decide on a specific degree path, or need additional academic preparation before transitioning into their intended major. **Mega-Majors allow students to explore areas of interest and get expert guidance on academic and career planning while completing coursework for UMKC's General Education Core requirements.** Prior to completing 60 credit hours, students are expected to declare a major with another UMKC Academic Unit.

**Please Note:** Students who do not place into MATH 110 Precalculus Algebra, MATH 116 Math for Liberal Arts, or higher may have to complete preparatory math coursework, potentially adding 3 or more hours to the total required for their degree.
